# Case Studies

## Case Study #1

Robin is a first time in college student who is having trouble proving residency. Robin is 19 years and has been estranged from her parents for two years. Robin attended a private high school for all four years. She has a valid state ID that she received over a year ago. Robin has been staying with various friends for the past three years, she is not registered to vote and she does not own a car. Robin has held a part time job for the last six months and makes \$7000 a year.

## Case Study #2

Grant is a 20-year-old transfer student who is coming to your institution after being out of school for 18 months. He is able to provide you with all of the necessary residency documentation and proofs of residency which are signed by his mother, Autumn.

## Case Study #2 Continued...

Two months into the semester, Autumn calls you and says she is actually Grant's ex-girlfriend and she forged the residency documentation because Grant's mother refused to complete the paperwork. Autumn and Grant have recently broken up and Autumn is feeling guilty for having signed the residency paperwork. She is worried that she may be in trouble even though she has no affiliation to your school.
